## **FY2002 Market Monitoring Test Results**

## Sample purchase test related to the Household Goods Quality Labeling Law "Apparel labeled 100% cashmere"

(National Institute of Technology and Evaluation)

In FY2002, NITE conducted a sample purchase test of "Apparel labeled 100% cashmere" to confirm their compliance with the quality labeling regulations for textile goods (hereinafter referred to as "labeling regulation") under the Household Goods Quality Labeling Law.

NITE purchased 12 sample products available in the market for the test; 3 men's coats, 3 women's coats, 4 women's scarves and 2 women's sweaters. Following results, 6 samples were deemed noncompliant with the labeling regulations.

The most prominent noncompliance item, found in 3 sample products; a men's coat, a women's coat and a women's scarf, was non-cashmere fiber content, ranging from 4-7 %, which exceeds the acceptable range (3%) allowed by the labeling regulations.

The table below shows the details of the identified noncompliance items.

NITE presented the test results to noncompliant labelers and conducted hearings with them for their opinions and measures to be taken. The results of the hearings, together with the test results, were reported to the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry (METI). Based on the test results, METI has given administrative guidance to the relevant labelers.
