FY2003 Market Monitoring Test Results

Sample purchase test related to the Household Goods Quality Labeling Law "Clothing made of 100% animal hair"

(National Institute of Technology and Evaluation)

In FY2003, NITE conducted a sample purchase test of "Clothing labeled as being made of 100% animal hair" to confirm their compliance with the quality labeling regulations for textile goods (hereinafter referred to as "labeling regulations") under the Household Goods Quality Labeling Law.

NITE purchased 10 sample clothing items available in the market; 4 coats for women, 5 sweaters for women (including unisex products) and 1 stole for women.

The tested animal hair includes wool, angora, alpaca and camel. Cashmere wool was excluded as NITE had tested the material in the previous year.

All sample products except one provided the proper labeling required by the labeling regulations.

The noncompliant item was improperly labeled for composition of fibers; the product, which was made of about 65% angora and 35% wool, was labeled 100% angora.

NITE has reported the test results to the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry (METI). Based on the test results, METI has given administrative guidance to the relevant labeler.
